CS-SuperPSU v3: Several improvements on the already superb power supply unit from CS have now been made. The v3 unit comes ready to supply 2x computers and 7x devices. It is thought that this will be

the last version adaptations as it is hard to see where it could possibly go next! A full range of adaptors are now available to fit almost any computer and drive combination. The CS-SuperPSU now supports: c64, c64c, c128, c128d, 1541-II (and clones), 1581, 1571d, CMD HD, CMD RL, FD2000, FD4000 and any IDE device. Please note that to support some devices a 'gender changer' will be required. The CS-SuperPSU is fully SuperCPU tolerant!

64HDD: Just announced by Nick Coplin are some more improvements to the 64HDD system. The 64HDD now has better support for D64/D71 images, file creation now suports PRG, SEQ and USR files. Secondly (and most importantly ? - ED) is support for GEOS! Fuller details will be in CS37.
