As we start the New Year we would like to extend our appreciation to all of you for helping to make *New Image Software* a success. It is you, the Sysops, that have given US the support and encouragement to continue on and we hope that we will be able to continue to enjoy your support in the months ahead.

As most of you know we sent out a 'survey' some time ago asking for your opinions on what you would like to see us do NEXT. The overwhelming choice, by about 74%, was that you want a *Programmers Manual* so we have targeted that as our next MAJOR project. Meanwhile, in order to not let any 'grass grow' under our feet we are announcing a NEW PLUS FILE DISK. This disk will include the *FIRST KNOWN* arcade game for a BBS, LASER CYCLE, written by SYSLLOB of Club Med in Philadelphia. This is a GREAT game.

You may have to limit the time your user can play this one!!

Also included on the plus file disk will be a few more games and utilities, as always, and as a *special bonus* we are including some of the IMAGE V1.1 ENHANCE-

MENTS that we have been developing since IMAGE was released. These enhancements include features such as *Joined/Unjoined, [P]ost [N]ext [Q]uit, Key files for the Lt.Kernal (replaces "u.alpha"),*

an improved ml read routine AND KEYBOARD COLORS!!

Yup, your users can now enter the color codes directly from the keyboard in the editor without resorting to

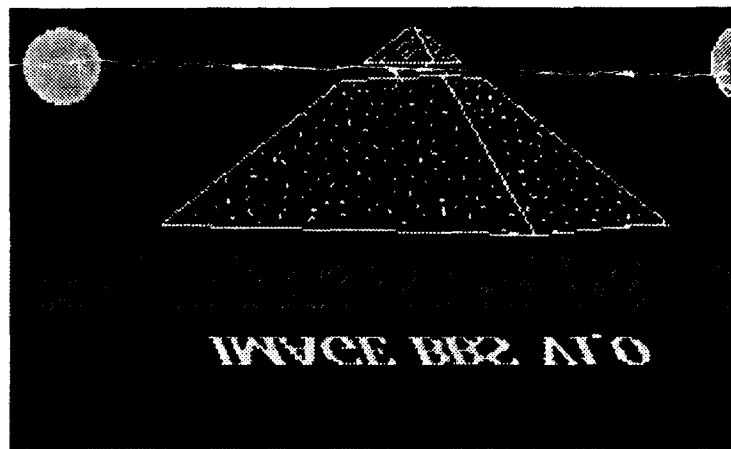
MCI commands, and it works! Other additions include the Post/Response credit system with character count. Also included will be a new "+.EM" with Verify/Edit, Selective Delete, Personal Storage area, etc. A "system password" has been added so you can reserve your system for the next call or for all calls, making it a "private" system.

It is also good to note here that the early problems we had with Xmodem and with multi-file transfer seem to have been elimi-



nated. This first issue was planned for several months and the intent has been to provide articles from all of the IMAGE people.
