LQ PRINT

GEOS LQ is a seperate application, with which Text documents can now be printed using GeoWrite and prints in almost Laserprinter quality! An optimum printeut can now be achieved from your printer and an excellent printout can be obtained from most 9 and 24 needle printers! The resulting printout is achieved without the usaul rough step-like edges appearing to the letters. Geos LQ is one of the first German programmes to come complete with an English Users Manual and English programme info-block, as well as all of the internal programme instructions translated into English. prgramme works with both the German and the American Geos main programmes Printer problems should now be a thing of the past, as all Epson-compatible printers are supported. The method of connection is immaterial either a serial or parallel linkup is possible. Parameter files, in the form of GeoWrite-files, include all of the relavent information. Sample-files, which can be used for practically all of the printer types, are supplied ready for use. Personal printer setups can be carried out with ease.

The programme Geos LQ can be obtained in the basic standard packet with two disks containing the main programme, Start LQ and various other programme files and includes 7 LQ Fonts. The standard packet costs DM 49.- plus DM 5.- for postage and packing. The complete packet consists 4 disks containing the usual printer files, other programme files and 45 LQ Fonts,

the price of DM79.- for this collection of excellent Geos software is very reasonable indeed. GEOS LQ functions in a similar way to GeoLaser. This means, where ever possible, that the largest font size is used to compute print-files necessary. Seven specially made LQ-Fonts are delivered with the main programme. Font-Utillities are also supplied, it is easy to make new Fonts and the alteration and changing of existing normal Fonts into LQ-Fonts is now "childs play". A clearly explained, 40 page Users manual is supplied. The manual is possibly too professionally explained places, in however everything is well laid out and well documented. A further mention should be given to the follwing points: GEOS LQ functions together with GEOS the Version 1.3 upwards, including all of the corresponding GeoWrite versions, as well as in the 80 character mode on the Ci28. The number of printed copies can be preset, complete document could be e.g. a 999 printed times. The print programme can be started from a GeoWrite document through the use of supplied desk-accessory 'Start LQ', as well as from any other application. If required the Text document can be used to pre-set the programme for printing. In GeoWrite all of the settings (Styles, Tabs, border settings, etc.) can be used. After printing is finished it is possible to return to GeoWrite, even to return directly to the previously printed document? Pictures in GeoWrite can also be printed without any problems! 1351 Mouse.

For all those of you who are still using a joystick to move around Geos here is a small insight to the whys and wherefores of using a mouse device. There are currently several options available when it comes to selecting a suitable mouse for use within Geos. One of the earlier Commodore mice was the 1350, this however was somewhat of a cheat as it was really based on a joystick and used electronics instead of micro-switches to operate the control port and gave some what of a jerky movement across the screen. The 1351 however is a true " proportional " mouse, which means that the pointer mimics the movement exactly , ie the pointer moves at the same speed as the mouse. Furthermore the speed at which the pointer can be moved about the screen is infinitley variable as it is dependant only upon how you move the mouse, unlike using the joystick which is set at a fixed rate unless you change it via the "Preference manager" which can be a lengthy process if you wish to change the speed depending on the task you wish to perform. In order to use a mouse with Geos you must have the appropriate "Input driver" present on the disk when you boot up of which there are plenty to choose from these are mainly for the 1351. The driver I currently use is called " Two buttons II " and is available on " geoCLUB disk 5 " (See comment below).

This driver makes use of both buttons on the mouse, in that the left button when double clicked will

" Ghost " an icon, and the right button when double clicked will open a programme. This stops that annoying problem when you double click too fast and getting the response " This file cannot be open from the desk top ". This I find to be the best solution in my set up as the mouse sits resident in port 2, whilst my joystick is in port I, as I have found that the mouse has to be plugged into the computer before powering up, otherwise the mouse does not always work if you plug it in after power up. So if you wish to swap from mouse to joystick all you have to do is drop down the Geos menu and open up " Change input device " without the need to reboot, which I have found very useful as when in GeoPaint the joystick can be sometimes better to draw with than the mouse. I recently picked up a second hand 1351 mouse but when I tried it with Geos it failed to work. This I found out later was due to the fact that even though it said 1351 underneath the mouse, it was in fact from an Amiga (Pardon my French), and is NOT a proportional device. Check the plug on the cable the true 1351 has a square block type of a plug where as the Amiga version has the more usual shaped plug as found on joysticks. It looks as though someone had changed the case on the mouse at some time. So take care as things are not always what they appear to be. The 1351 has one more trick up its tail yet and that is if you really want to you can configure the mouse as a joystick. This is done by holding down the right hand button on the mouse during power up. This means that the mouse can be used with any other software that uses a joystick for icon control.




Christmas bonus for Commodore

SPEED-UP CHIP FOR THE C128



It looks like there are attempts to make the C128 work much faster with the development of a super chip. The work is being done by ZIP Technology who have already produced such a chip for the Apple computers. ZIP have agreed to develop the board as long as certain conditions are met. Parsec Inc. the mail order company have agreed to meet these conditions and market the board when it is finished. The man behind this project and head man at Parsec Inc Mr. John Brown is asking for a deposit of \$50 towards the purchase price of an accelerator board and/or chip for the C128/C128D. This will be a 8MHz or 10MHz speed up board. Parsec Inc can keep this deposit for a period up to 8 months from the time of deposit while developing the board. When the work is finished Parsec Inc agrees to sell the board to the depositor for \$200 or less and it will be guaranteed to be compatable with the majority software and hardware.
