Feel free to delete the version you dislike {yeah that can mean both of them}

Editor/SysOp: Well the cover experiment didn't work out that well for the print issue. There are two images on the cover {mentioned for CyberSpace readers}. A sort of happy face with a logo around it, and a photo that I snapped in experimentation. No.30 found the little pic. Comes from a anime called "Ghost in the Shell, Stand Alone Complex". Maybe little isn't the right term, tiny is better. In fact it prints out unscaled as about the size of the eraser on a #2 pencil. Oh and it is in a light blue colour. Don't know if "gimp" would have helped in making it better for presentation. As the picture didn't scale. Yet in this case, I made it a 1"x 1" image. The photocopier, more on that thing in a bit, actually made the text semi legible. FWIW: says "I Thought that what I'd do is I'd pretend I was one of those dead-mutes". Right it makes a lot more sense if you have seen the entire series.

Honestly I am wondering if it is worth the risk to just print out, in double side, the print issues. That is the reason I am going into this for the meeting. Pic I

described in the last issue. A hand painted <yeah by me> lead figure that is about 1 1/2" tall. Or for scale I think it was 32mm. Not that I do metric at all. That tile is ceramic and 1/8th inch. OK no idea of the metric measurement. Tis the width of a cassette tape. Also it is 1" x 1" square. Sitting on the right hand corner of this 128D, as seen in the picture. OK here is what is interesting and leading me up to my question, and the cost for the idea.

Dark & grainy is the image on the print issue. This was shot in the style called "sepia" if I spelled that right. Where the black streak on the left came from I have no idea. There is a round thing just above the "r" in the picture. That is the bottom screw on the SCPU. On the right of the pic is a roll of paper from the cash register here in the shop. The figure is black uniform, strawberry blonde hair <br/>bitch to mix that colour>, OD green boots, gloves and belt. Gold Eagle on her right shoulder and gold armour pad on her left. Right got all of that logged in. So why does the Orange illustration of a girl show up so well? She is on an antique pint glass milk bottle, used for a pen holder. As the copy from the printer is much easier to see.

Now when this was printed out I thought it would make the images easier to see for us. Since the new printer at laser quick is not being as friendly to our gray scale as the old one. I did point that out to the guy there, but hey with the smaller print run. Well he has to staple and fold the issues by hand now. And there is no extra charge for that work.

So here is my point and question. We are down to and average of 10 print copies going out each month. We could print them on the HP 2100TN laser jet. In booklet form it is 5 sheets of paper, for a total of 50 sheets. I still have a ream or so of white printer paper < reams of that yellow stuff I cut to fit>. In order to make the newsletters here, we would need to score up at least one more toner cart. Cheapest I have found them is around \$26 + shipping. I would need to learn how to print them double sided. A task with the imported font isn't as easy as if I used a resident <evil> font in the printer. But I think it can be done, with practice. The other thing is that we would need to have a new stapler. As what we use at this time is an antique one from the 50s or earlier. We need a stapler that has a longer, for lack of the proper term, staple bar. So that at least 5 1/2" is from front to back. In order to staple the issues. Last time I looked and that was at the most expensive place in town and several years ago. Cost for that was \$36. I'll try to see what is cheaper locally. Costs us up to \$15 each month to do the newsletters. Depending on any sample copies that go out to prospective members that want print. Roughly speaking we are spending close to 20 cents per sheet to have them copied and folded and stapled. Word that came to me is that we would be spending about 2-5 cents per sheet to do it ourselves. We could save money that way, but we have to out lay a bit first. So then what should we do? If we go for doing it here. I'll cover the cost and get paid back from ebay and shop sales. Since the cost is for A.C.U.G. things. Send me feed back on this, contact info is on page #2 of the newsletter. {Update: That stapler was not found at any other local source}

Now that out of the way, The CyberSpace issue! Things didn't go as planned. You know the old adage of the best laid plans of mice, men

and machines...? That is about what happened. CyberSpace readers got a fast email on the situation with their copies. For the record, a test was made of a few pages, laid out in GeoPub with jpegs and sent to Nigel at CommodoreFree. These where about 4 pages for articles. Doing the eps part and then placing them in the Scribus programme. Making them into one file. Worked and looked good with the scaling ability. 22 pages of the CyberSpace issue had some problems. Failed to import at a certain page number. OK No.8 and I guessed that there must be an upper limit based on something in memory or a thing like that. His system wouldn't take more than 5 pages. I got up to 10 pages. Made one group of 10. Started on the other and when I went to save the file. Using their default SLA format. Said it was done, and said it crashed with a #6 some sort of error. Really does use a lot of memory power.

OK gang, time was short, and I couldn't find the files that should be on the desktop with the .sla extension. Still don't know where they went. Can tell you that everything slows down when this prg is running. Well time was short, OK that means several days past my self imposed deadline. I had made the usual method of a post script file. Turning that into the issue for the month. Can't say that the idea is going to work for the 20+ page issues of the CyberSpace Village Green. Maybe it is asking too much of that programme? Or too much of my limited skills. Not that hard to insert the pages of EPS into the programme. Anyway, more testing is on the books to see if it can be done. Still don't know how to merge existing files in this programme. No.8 is helping as his time allows. So this issue may be in the new way, or it may be in the old way. Do want to add that those 4 page test files. Well where just a bit over a meg in size. Meaning that there is a fear of the size of the newsletter being past my 15 meg limit at vcs for an attachment.

Deputies: Large amount of work has been

done in shop. As we tried to make space for the new items brought to us from No.21. Well what that really means is that we had to do a mess of things real fast to make space. By doing that, some missing things have been found. Yet it showed the need for better planning and organizing. Putting #30 into the understanding and need to work on the newsletters. Placing them in sleeves and binders for our records, and the scanning for the CDs. Sort of came into play when the stack of the recent master copies fell onto the printer. Along with that is problem with some copies lost in the stacks in the kibbutz, having become scratching posts for felines. Things just not on track with the sho-vah daily attacks on us. What this means is that No.30 will be doing the above tasks of sorting. At - to the exclusion of the other projects in the shop/group. Then from his own collection of newsletters, we will be able to scan them for our records. Well the one task that is going to continue is the move from the old disk boxes to the new file drawer type. That labels have been created for, so that we can have the ACUG library of disks in better order. A task that had been in the planning stages for a long time. Anything missing because of the sho-vah attacks, at least in the last 12 years. No.30 has in his collection. Letting us copy that for our permanent library. That will also be put on CD in the future for further preservation.

No.16 pops by as he can for C= things. Life and work schedules have been unkind to him recently. As he has work, National Guard and is doing what he can as mediator in stopping the sho-vah from attacking us. Though when he can make it to the shop. Work on projects does happen.

S.I.G.'s: Been doing some experiments with the GeoPub programme. Trying to duplicate the ability to insert a jpeg in page graphics. As that is possible. Proof is that the license agreement document is done that way with a jpeg in the top right corner. Sadly at this time, we are not able to install anything that comes out. Neither in the disk file or printed out on the printer. Using post print 3.8. Next test is to try the v4 version. But hope isn't that great since that version and PP2 are on the disk. How it is done is past us at this stage. More on this in a later report this issue. Have been making new labels for C= things in the shop. File drawers and disk boxes. Aiding No.30 in the sorting work of disks. Programming is slow, interest is there and I am working on finding the JP-4 to toss on the embers and flame it up. Having a lot of trouble with work and life schedules. Along with the small problem of the stacks of things that are now covering the area to the work stations for the C=.

Demo Discussion Close: A few of the works of No.21 shown on his laptop with the emulator. Such as the Judge Dredd game from the tape version. Along with the history and Dox as provided/written by LR. A demo of the history and background of the MHI crew from start in early 80s to 2008ce. Shorts of other demos fixed and a couple of recently fixed games.

Discussed the items that No.21 brought us, and greedy hands reached for them. Getting bitten off at the elbow by the rabid and savage <u>LR</u>. Testing and

In order to gain good images for modding for the intro screens. A task that is in theory at this time. Discussed on the adventures and other work for out of print games to be made in Geos and placed on the CD for MossyCon6. There is a large milk crate of projects that are up to 30 years old that need to be done. Not just for the CD but also for the game group. Of course done in Geos. Setting time aside for the other members to work on things in the shop, was a topic. Trying to work out a schedule with fluctuating times in peoples lives. Matching that to shop times and when the C= units are open for use. Not an easy task right now. Closed: 8:15pm for the game and more <u>C=</u> talk. Like that ever stops around here.

He has in the past helped us out with the old vacuum Tube BBS. Running on Omni-128. Along with several past visits from Idaho to us, helping and doing a copy party. This time on his way to work out a V.A. thing. He stopped by and has been working on e-texting some of the new books we gained and preserving some of our recently acquired disks.

Brought us a CD of <u>C=</u> things. Personally I was going over several hundred fonts for Geos. Before looking at the rest. Many of them are common ones that I used to have on the BBS U/D area. Others are ones that I have never seen. Like Dungeon 3 and a AD&D font. I had around 65 fonts that he didn't have and cut them for him. Currently looking for more fonts that he is missing. As we are working on having duplicates between us for preservation. New project if it works out is a tool that will allow me to convert jpegs to Koala. Just have to keep bugging him for that tool. Now then both print & Cyberspace readers will be seeing some B&W images in this issue. While hunting for some disks. I found one that I did over 10 years ago. Geos Photo Albums of some handy scanner work. Yeah things that I scanned in the early days of my Handy Scanner practice. These where done from, well the Judge Dredd Stuff is from the game that was trained/tamed by No.21, well the original tape cover. Rest are from game books. Placed in here as a new experiment, as I gain enough confidence to try some more things to improve our newsletter.



Thing for these experiments in placement of a photo album image. Simply is to see how it works, so that there might be a way to add graphics directly into the issue for the print as well as CyberSpace readers. OK of course you know that I have ideas for writing up game stuff with this concept as well {EG}.

What is being tested is space for the major part. Yeah sure this is easy to do in GeoPub. Make a box where you want and stash the photo album image into the spot. Got a couple of problems with this in our current work. Ah man like there is no GeoPaint anything in the GeoPub copy that we have working. EPS, PS, JPEG we have for graphics, and I can't figure how to make them work. That is in a different section. If a photo

album image can be inserted in the document in Post Print. I didn't see that on the options menu. GeoPaint yeah, no photo album or photo scrap could I see listed. So for this experiment I am using the photo albums and the C=/W key to insert them. Right then we are at the part that will be used on the next insertion. Still in the space idea.



Now there we have a nicely attired girl scan, from a Lost Worlds game book. Yeah clipped a bit on the sides and bottom. Because the size of the actual image to the Handy Scanner. Nope I haven't learned how to do multiple scan and over lay them to make one larger scan for use. Though I understand that it is possible without the page fox thing that I picked up and haven't fired up yet. So many things to learn about the Commodore tools.

So then what is this space thing? Well as you can see the images are centered in GeoWrite, yeah that is where they are being installed at the time that I write these lines. How will it look for the print version? How will it look in columns in the CyberSpace edition? Not sure at all on this one. Well in print I had done one experiment earlier. When I did the lay out of that board with jumpers for Eddie the One. Came out OK, in both editions. but at that time we were still experimenting with set up. I don't remember if that issue was in columns or not for the CyberSpace readers. That is why the images are being tossed in here of different sizes, to see how they will fit. As well as showing another aspect of what we can do with the <u>C=</u>.

The Tale of the GeoPub Graphic Tests

Mentioned earlier about the inability to make the JPEG images appear in GeoPub. Now then it isn't a well kept secret that this copy of mine is a demo/pirate copy of Todd's update. I have written to him about the one I have and have asked for the price for an official copy with dox. As of meeting time, there has been no reply to this request. Like to have one that works, with the understanding of how to do the insertion of JPEGs into the actual GeoPub document. Be something that would improve both versions of the Village Green.

Anyway what we have tried is to put the JPEGs into the pages in GeoPub. Now I'll make this short, as space is eaten up with the graphics and I am expecting at least one submission for this issue from members. So it goes this way. Wasn't able to do it in Page Layout. Found that could be done in Page Graphics. Early tests just gave a box that was about 2/3 of the page. Later learned about how to scale that to a different size. Tested some and they came out as a large gray box. When I printed them out. If I was lucky I saw the same thing when I made the disk file. I noticed that the size of the file was not big enough in my mind to have been the entire page with the JPEG. Thought that maybe it was because colour was on/off for print/disk file. Nope that wasn't the problem, or if it is, changing it didn't correct anything. Put the verify file on the ram and tried again. No idea of what that file actually does for the system. Still no joy in MossyTown.

Looked at the files on the disk. There is a large GeoPub, the GeoPub "news" icon for a file and a GeoWrite file. Those are the license agreement thing. PP2, PP3 < really 4> and that verify prg. Along with a jpeg, that being the splash thing for the new GeoPub logo. Took the bits into the ram and in GeoPub looked them over. Here I saw that the JPEG is installed in the Page Graphic option. Well I took a couple of simple pix with the camera. Popped the disk into the FD, ran GeoDos, put the pix into the ram. Switched back to Wheels, and fired up GeoPub. Went into the

Page Graphic area, where I selected the photo album icon. Clicked on the screen, went through the options till JPEG showed up. Picked one of the two B&W images as that is how I shot them. Insert here that the GeoPub image is a gray scale, and it is larger than the ones I shot. Well I set and scaled the first one. Then installed the second one. Not worried about how right they would look scaled. Nope wanted to see them in there!

Into post print, a tool that the user agreement says I need. Laid out the page with the two JPEGs on it, and having them also still in the ram. Told it to make a linux disk file. Then told it to print out the page. Print out was done first with colour off, and then with colour on. both times there is a nice thin





black frame. Around a dark gray box where the smegging pic is supposed to be located. Linux file was a blank sheet. So till further information comes along. Not going to be able to use this method for the JPEGs.

# CyberSpace Stuff

Still have to take the pix for this issue. Going to work on a new idea for layout. See about doing better with the text under the picture. Experience will show how to do the work. Well I hope it will {BG}.

Some of this will be in the next issue for the print readers. You guys get it first. Print issue ended with a fast note about Karl Konka passing away. Some issues didn't have the last part. Explain that in a little bit. Apparently he fell into the river and drowned, washed up a couple of days later. We here were not notified till the 27th of September. He was found on the 11th.

OK as to why some the print readers didn't get half of a sentence on their copies. The text fit on the last text page for them. That is till after the spell checking. Unknown to me that forced about 5 words to move to the picture page. You see that this print issue was all done right here in the <u>C=</u> bunker. Each copy printed out on the printer, hand folded and stapled. Quality, well of the print out, not the content, is vastly better than what comes from the print shop. The above photos are clear as is the text. So unless there are problems with the bleed through. This is the way we will make the issues. Took some time to process the jpegs. Then staple with the long stapler, fold, followed by stapling the side and pop on a stamp. Less photos will speed up the process. Personally I like what came out this time around. Though I made one test copy as the last one for a local member. Used the yellow/orange paper for just the cover. Looked even better. Will do that for all the copies next issue. In any event, there is still a

lot of work to be done on this project. Setting the fold right, creasing it even. Hey with my eyes that isn't a great and easy thing to do, everything for me is at a 30 degree slant to the right {G}.

# CyberSpace Pictures

OK gang, I shot some pix, and found on a disk some that had been done earlier. Still a new novelty that pictures can be put on a floppy disk. Sorry no, I have to shoot new ones for those of us here in the CyberSpace issue. As we get colour and I have to do B&W for now in the print issue. Till I can find a colour printer for that task. Now then listing here what I shot for CyberSpace. As it may not all work out with disk space as the ps file.

The fan for the 1541, CBM plotter, in the plastic bags, no manual though in that box, even has some pens. 1701 logo, and the 1701 monitor, gained 2 of them. As shown in another pic with the Star printer on top. A C-16 in the box, which went to No.30 to replace the one stolen by his family members. And the one that has to be placed in here, Mad Max/MHI. # CyberSpace Short Issue Explained

Well guys this is the 8th attempt at making the CyberSpace issue. Made a long journal in the other attempts. first attempt was fine. Save for the fact that there was the front jpeg over the title for that jpeg. Welcome to Pinacolda was on the line, not above it and the gray scale for the text colour was too faint to be read, then a big smegging frell up. As for some reason. I think it is the fact that I deleted the black and white pic from the disk in the camera. Created a false reading of the images seen on the camera screen to the actual number. Only 15 in the camera, but on Geodos the directory read 17. Well thenumber on the camera screen said it was the right picture, so not being able to see them in the issue. I titled the boxes in GeoPub, and popped in the jpegs in post print. Converted the post script file to pdf and saw that the images where all wrong.

Next attempts have been dramatic failures. My colour boxes are in the right spots. Along with the outline box and text for the pictures, all in the right colour and on the right pages in the right spots. However for reasons that I am not fully certain. We ended up with triple printing on some columns. Blank columns, just boxes of colour, not over any text, and others in the wrong places for the text. As the text was in the wrong place.

I think that part of it was trying to put the colour boxes around some of the hewaders for areas. where geoPub didn't show me the font used. I tried to compensate for that by making the coloured box bigger. Sems that may have pushed things into chaos after that point. Or so it seems. One attempt that was #7 actually. Had half of page #2. Officers, policy, history, contacts and next meeting. Half of the policy part was onpage #2 in the center of the page reduced to a 40 column status. Rest of it was on page #3 underneath the meeting notes. Honestly I can see the possibility of some of the errors. But not all of them. Good thing that I copied the main file several times before starting GeoPub.

As this has to be done in two parts. GeoPub having a 16 page limit per file. All of the two pages that I had created each time. Came out fine in the pdf. No colour problems or text mix ups.

OK then, time to explain the look of this issue. First of there is a lot of white space around the jpegs. This is because they are not scaled for this issue. I mean that in post print I didn't make them fit the boxes. This is the size they are when they are inserted onto the page.

Reason for this is that a long time ago I had tried to make an issue using jpegs from another source than this camers. They where larger in size of kb. 5 of them when made into the pdf was too big for the heretic formatted 1.44mb disk. Not knowing how this would turn out with 7 jpegs. I decided not to make them any larger than the stock size. Working on the placement with a box and text for them. Get that down right and the issue will look better. Placement is a bit better, that comes from a lot of practice on this issue <S>

Anyway, time to dash this of into GeoPub and to the post print and then see if it works. Or do I have to abandon GeoPub for this month. I do apologize for the lessor quality of this issue.
